Pace Environmental Notes is published each month during the school year, September through May. Back issues may be found by following the P.E.N. link on the Law Library's "Internet Resources" web page.

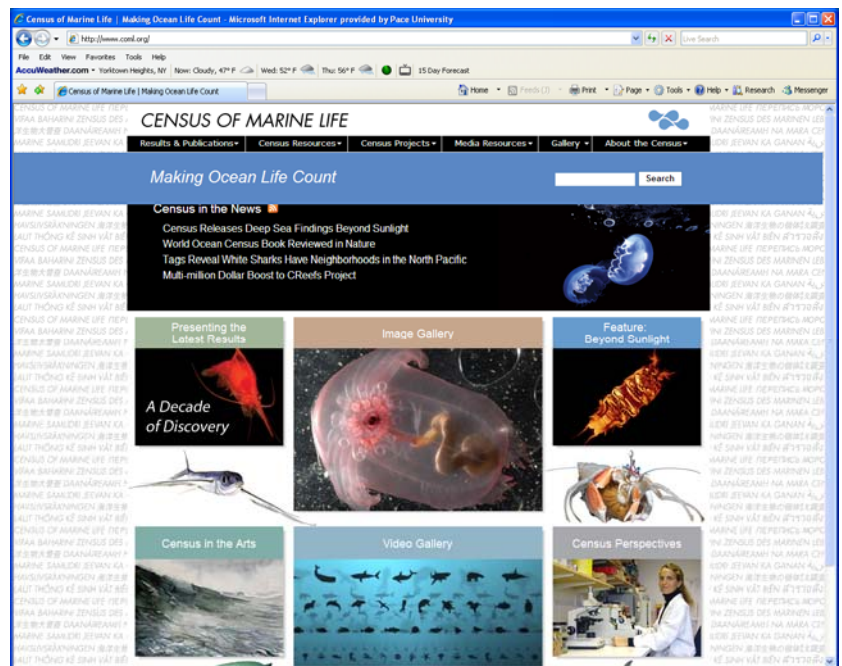

The Census of Marine Life is a worldwide project representing the work of researchers from over 80 nations. The goal is to catalog the diversity and distribution of the world's marine life. The full census will be made available in 2010.

The website is navigated by a menu bar across the top of the page. The Results and Publications link offers books and reports, and films by project members and associates. Census Resources offers a monthly newsletter, a bibliographic database of Project publications, and links to partner organizations among other resources.
