Pace Environmental Notes is published each month during the school year, September through May. Back issues may be found by following the P.E.N. link on the Law Library's "Internet Resources" web page.

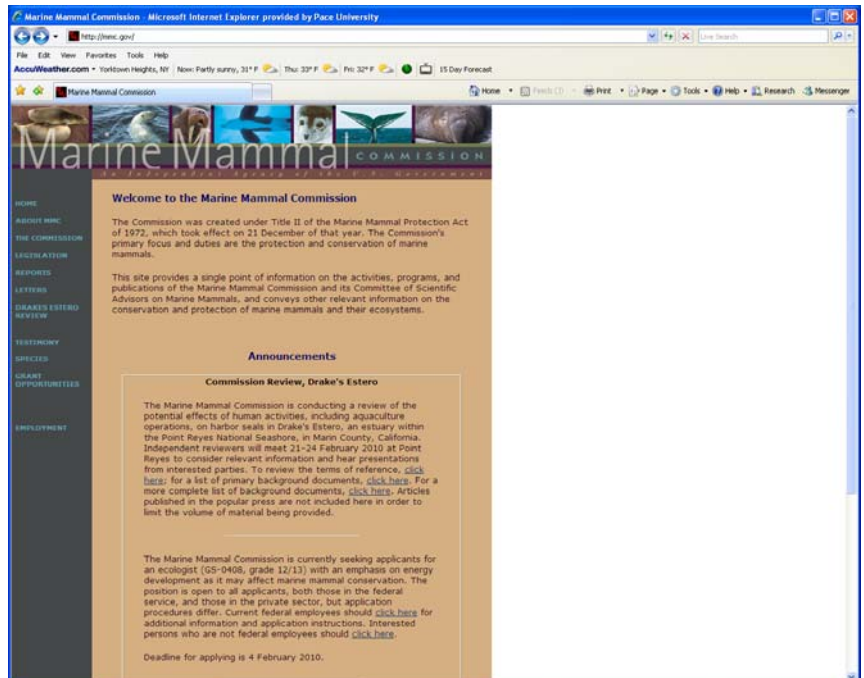

### Marine Mammal Commission.

Anti-whaling activists made headlines recently with their actions to [prevent Japanese whaling ships from taking whales](#) in the Antarctic region. The United States Marine Mammal Commission was created by the [Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972](#) to protect and conserve marine mammals under U.S. jurisdiction and to coordinate international efforts on behalf of these species. The marine mammals covered by the act include various species of whales, seals, otters, walrus, and polar bears.

The Commission website provides information about the Commission including research, legislation, and Congressional testimony. The web site is navigated by a menu on the left side



of the screen. Information includes Legislation, Reports, Letters, Drakes Estero Review, Testimony, Species, Grant Opportunities, and Employment. The Legislation links offers amended versions of the Marine Mammal Protection Act and the Endangered Species Act.

The Reports link offers a selection of Commission Annual Reports, Project and Workshop Reports, Commission Publications, Administrative Reports and other publications. The Letters link provides information on Commission advice and liaison work with other agencies, the Drakes Estero Review provides information and research on the ongoing work on the estuary at the Point Reyes National Park, located in California. The link to Testimony provides copies of the Commission Chairman's testimony to Congress, while the Species link offers information on the species of mammals listed and their status as threatened or endangered. The remaining links provide information dear to the hearts of academics, to wit, Grant Information and Employment.
