

Dear Haub Law Community,

Out of an abundance of caution in light of Haub Law's two positive coronavirus cases, we have decided to temporarily transition our in-person classes and extracurricular activities to fully remote mode for the upcoming week as we await further results from contact tracing and additional testing.

This temporary transition applies to all classes and student activities and does not affect administrative operations.

By Friday evening, October 23, we should have more testing and tracing information at hand and we will announce then whether to continue remote-only instruction and activities for a full two-week period.

After two first-year students living in Dannat Hall tested positive on Friday, October 16, we moved them into isolation. We also moved all Dannat Hall residents into quarantine and implemented further testing. We await the results of that testing.

Dannat Hall students have displayed fortitude and resilience in the wake of their current circumstances. They are being well taken care of and they will be tested again Tuesday, October 20. The results of those tests will be known soon after. Also, on Monday, October 19, our program of community testing will continue in person as planned.

This decision to temporarily transition to entirely remote learning for next week was made in consultation with Pace University officials and health authorities, and was driven by the desire to ensure the health and safety of the entire Haub Law community and its neighbors. We feel that erring on the side of our health and safety is the best approach.
