Update from Dean Anderson on health and safety measures for Haub Law

Dear Haub Law Community,

Since my last health and safety update, we have completed two rounds of COVID-19 testing among our quarantined students in Dannat Hall, as well as a round of community testing. The Dannat Hall testing revealed two more cases among the quarantined students. The four positive students have all been isolated from other students, and the quarantine of all students living in Dannat Hall will continue for another week as previously announced.

In light of the four positive coronavirus tests among the Dannat population, we will be extending our temporary transition to remote learning for another week for **1L classes only** until Friday, October 30. Other classes next week will return to the status they had before this past week, whether that was in-person, remote or hybrid.

Also, any upper level students currently in quarantine in Dannat Hall will also continue with remote learning until the quarantine is lifted on October 31.

Community testing on the Haub Law campus will continue on Tuesday.

The decision to extend the temporary transition to remote learning another week for 1L classes and those in quarantine in Dannat Hall was made in consultation with Pace University officials and health authorities. We will continue to monitor the situation and adjust our course where necessary to protect the health and safety of the entire Haub Law community and its neighbors.
