John Lee is the Deputy Director for Green Buildings and Energy Efficiency at the NYC Mayor's Office of Long Term Planning and Sustainability. In this capacity, he is leading the city's policy and legislative efforts driving the built environment to unprecedented energy efficiency standards. John's previous public sector service was with the NYC Department of Buildings as Senior Architect in the codes development division, and with the Department of City Planning where he served as an Urban Designer. During his early career, John was Art Director for a web development firm consulting to a suite of corporate clients in the energy sector and in consumer product goods, and was also a design architect in private sector architecture firms working on institutional buildings, transit facilities, and master plans for universities. John currently holds the Mayor's voting seat on the New York State Uniform Code Council. He is a licensed architect and a graduate of Rice University and Harvard University.
