Amanda Kennedy is RPA's Connecticut director, leading the organization's research, planning and advocacy activities in the state. At RPA, Ms. Kennedy has coordinated the New York–Connecticut Sustainable Communities Consortium, developed strategies and metrics for Bridgeport's BGreen 2020 environmental sustainability initiative and researched and developed tools illustrating the effects of land use on travel patterns. Her recent work includes *Halfway There* and *Getting Back on Track*, publications that assess transit and transit-oriented development capacity along Connecticut's New Haven Metro-North line. Amanda is co-chair of RPA's Fourth Regional Plan Housing Working Group.

Ms. Kennedy received her master's in city and regional planning from the Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy at Rutgers University, where she received the AICP Award for Outstanding Scholarship, and her B.A. with honors in anthropology from Yale University. She received a 2014 "Friend of Public Transportation" award from the Connecticut Association for Community Transportation.
