Jennifer Li is a Staff Attorney and Adjunct Professor of Law with the Harrison Institute for Public Law at Georgetown University Law Center, where she teaches a policy clinic and leads work on climate adaptation, community development, and human rights. Her recent publications include a chapter on local government and climate adaptation in the *Law of Environmental Protection* (Environmental Law Institute, 2021); her research on climate adaptation and resilient affordable housing has been featured in *Greauxing Resilience at Home: A Regional Vision* (Georgetown Climate Center, 2022), *Managed Retreat Toolkit* (GCC, 2020), and *Equitable Adaptation Toolkit* (GCC 2020). Before coming to Georgetown, Jennifer was a Fulbright Scholar in India, where she researched climate policy and developed an international human rights course at Jindal Global Law School. In law school, she was a Crowley Scholar in International Human Rights and conducted extensive fieldwork in South and Southeast Asia. Jennifer is currently the Program Director for the Environment, Energy, and Natural Resources Law Fellows (ELF) Mentorship Program, and served on the steering committee of the D.C. Bar's EENR Community from 2020-2023. She began her legal career at the criminal defense firm of Brafman & Associates in New York. Jennifer received her LL.M. from Georgetown, J.D. from Fordham Law School, and B.A. from NYU.
