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## **PART C: SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**

Scholarship applications are considered and decided by the Graduate Admissions Committee. The Committee will consider a scholarship application only (i) after the candidate has submitted a completed application and been accepted to the LLM or SJD program and (ii) before the candidate begins his or her graduate law program. In its decisions, the Committee may give preference to candidates who show (i) strong academic performance, and (ii) documentation of financial need. The Committee's decisions are final.

Scholarships are awarded and credited against tuition for a specific academic year and are not automatically renewed. However, candidates may reapply for subsequent years. An award made for the full academic year will be credited in equal parts against tuition for each of the Fall and Spring semesters.

Scholarship awards made for full-time enrollment (12 credits or more) may be reduced on a pro-rata basis if the student subsequently enrolls part-time.
