You must have an average grade of B or better and no grade below C. Also, all candidates seeking the certificate must graduate with an overall GPA of 2.5 or better. See list of courses attached. ## Writing Requirement: Starting with the Fall 2018 Entering class.

To qualify for the International Law Certificate, the student must write one significant research paper on an international law topic, broadly defined (e.g., private or public international law, international human rights law, international business or trade law, refugee and immigration law). The written product must be in the form of a research paper, scholarly article, legal memorandum, or law review note. The written product must be at least 15 double-spaced pages, demonstrate an appropriate level of legal research and analysis, be well-organized and well-written, and contain ample citation to legal authority. Other products may be accepted with prior approval by the Director of the International Law Certificate. A student may use this paper to also satisfy the ULWR requirement if it is written on an international law topic and otherwise satisfies the criteria for the ULWR.
